




We are on a journey to success ...

How we travel and how we complete our journey depends on what we do along the way.




The road to success has many twists and turns ...


Look at the picture below. Name three important things that you think contributed to the singer's success. Write these things in the boxes provided.




Look at the picture below. Name three important things that you think contributed to the plumber's success. Write these things in the boxes provided.

Look at the picture below. Name three important things that you think contributed to the success of the office manager. Write these things in the boxes provided. What do you think is missing from the journey of the unemployed person?







What are the most important items you have listed? Discuss them with your peers and agree on the three most important things.


